PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT, during its January 5, 2021 Board Meeting the Village of Monroe Board of Trustees authorized a Public Hearing to be scheduled on Tuesday, January 19, 2021 at 6:45 on a proposed Local Law entitled “A Local Law Authorizing a property tax levy in excess of the limit established by General Municipal Law subdivision 5, S. 3-c”. The purpose of this proposed Local Law is to allow the Village to override the limit on the amount of real property taxes that may be levied by the Village of Monroe pursuant to General Municipal Law S. 3-c, and to allow the Village of Monroe to adopt a village budget for (a) village purposes and (b) any other special or improvement district governed by the Board of Trustees for the fiscal year 2022 (6/1/21 – 5/31/22) that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the “tax levy limit” as defined by General Municipal Law subdivision 5, S. 3-c.

This Local Law, if adopted, will relieve the Village of the prohibition against increasing a tax levy by more than 2% as imposed by Municipal Law S. 3-c. As the Village of Monroe relies upon the assessments of the Town of Monroe and therefore cannot anticipate the impact of resolutions of tax certiorari matters or other unanticipated expenses, the restrictions of General Municipal Law would potentially impose a great hardship upon the Village or require borrowing otherwise deemed unnecessary.
